

## **OCAC Board Meeting Minutes**

**June 11, 2007**

OCAC Chair Alice Levinson called the meeting to order. Corrections to the May 2007 minutes were requested for the names of Robert Kintz, Wendy Gellert, and Alice Levinson. Robert Kintz moved that the minutes be accepted. Linda Marco seconded the motion.

Updates to the Director's Report: It is reported that the Chapel Hill Herald will be closing. They will distribute our Summer/Fall, 2007 newsletter in their Sunday, July 1<sup>st</sup> edition.

The OCAC had a request for the topic of "Time Management for Artists" for an upcoming Artists' Salon. Leah Rade, Alice Levinson, Wendy Gellert, Mary Jane Felgenhauer and Mary Harley Kruter will meet soon to plan the August 17<sup>th</sup> Artists' Salon on this topic.

Dr. Barnsley Brown, a Creative Coach, contacted staff RE: being a presenter at a future Artists' Salon to talk about "bartering". It was agreed that she should be invited to come to our next board meeting (August) to give a brief presentation.

The 10<sup>th</sup> annual AmericanStyle Magazine's readers poll ranked Chapel Hill 13th on the list of top small cities for the arts (with populations under 100,000). Chapel Hill was one of only three North Carolina cities to make the magazine list published in the June 2007 issue.

The Animal Services Public Art Project (dog sculptures) will be relocated to the Community Center in Cedar Grove before the end of August 2007.

Economic Development Commission (EDC) Update – Willie Best, new Assistant County Manager, will serve as interim EDC Director, until someone is hired permanently.

The OCAC then went into closed session to make recommendations on the Spring 2007 grant applications.
